Topic: Time

Planet Maths: Pgs 143 – 147

Time is a topic that a lot of children find challenging. We completed work on the clock earlier in the year where we practiced reading the time on a clock and changing analogue time to digital and vice versa in 5 minute intervals. It would be a good idea to recap this work.

Your child should have a clock in their folder that shows digital and analogue so they can use this to help them. See below image of the clock. You can call out a time and get them to make it on the clock or ask them to tell you the time in digital if you call it out in analogue.

E.g. 5 past 10 = 10:05 or 4:15 = a quarter past 4.

Next: We are going to change hours and minutes to minutes only and change minutes to hours and minutes. The key thing to remember is that there are **60 minutes in one hour**.

E.g. 1 hr 10 mins = 60 mins + 10 mins = 70mins.

E.g. 65 mins = 1 hr 5 mins

Complete questions C2 & C3 on page 143 in your copy.

Next: addition and subtraction of hours and minutes pg 144 A1 & A2, pg 145 A, B1, B2. Use the examples in the book as your guide.

Most of the other work on time/timetables can be completed orally. Your child will need support while working through this topic. Work at your child's pace. If some questions are too challenging then don't feel that you have to complete them all.



Reading & Comprehension: Reading Zone, The Golden Harp Unit 23 The Chernobyl Children's Project International pgs 92 - 95. Pupils read through the text and complete Activities A, B, C, D & E in their copies. Remember to use full sentences and use the text to help avoid any spelling errors.

Vocabulary Development: Read through the red words from above mentioned Unit 23. Ensure that your child can read all of these and understands what they mean. Use a dictionary to clarify any words and/or put them into sentences orally/written. Daily practice on these is necessary to learn them thoroughly.

Free Writing: Pupils can pick a topic of interest and write about it. Spellings are not important during free writing, the focus is getting your thoughts down on paper. This can be fiction writing (a story) or factual (real life). Keeping a diary is also a good option, write down daily what you are getting up to.

Extra Work: Using your laptop/tablet/phone research Chernobyl and the nuclear disaster that took place there.
